# Legal Advocacy Fund Margaret Stewart



In December the U.S. Supreme Court heard oral arguments in the case of AT&T vs. Hulteen, a case which involves a group of women who took pregnancy leave before 1978, when the Pregnancy Discrimination Act was passed. The pensions paid to these women were much smaller than those paid to women who took pregnancy leave at AT&T after the act was passed.

AAUW, together with the National Women's' Law Center, has signed an amicus brief in support of the women who received smaller pensions. They argue that their pensions should not be based on the older, discriminatory policy.

This case is illustrative of the kind that the Legal Advocacy Fund is now looking to support, namely that of women in any workplace, not just academia that will set precedents to gain justice for the plaintiffs and prevent future discrimination.





In Poland during WWII the director of the Warsaw zoo and his wife sheltered over 300 Jews and other resisters in their residence and in the zoo's structures. Despite the risks to themselves and damage to the zoo grounds from German bombs, the zookeepers aided the resistance movement and made life as normal as possible for their guests. A dramatic story that illuminates the profound connection between humans and nature, and celebrates life's beauty, mystery and tenacity.

# MAY Book (Asian Pacific American Heritage Month) The Rape of Nanking: the Forgotten Holocaust of World War II by Iris Chang

Late in 1937 the Imperial Japanese Army captured Nanking, then the capital of China, during the Second Sino-Japanese War. Over the next couple months they engaged in a genocidal attack on the population, raping, torturing and murdering hundreds of thousands of Chinese citizens. Descriptions of the atrocities are graphic and disturbing. Some heroes emerge, including a Nazi living in China for decades who intervened to save many Chinese from death


