Local Scholarships Jenny Harvey



Our AAUW branch awards a \$1,000 Ida King Stevens scholarship to a University of Illinois student based on the following guidelines:

1. Be female.

2. Preference given to IL residents (as defined by U. of I. assessing in-state tuition).

3. Have experienced an interruption in formal education of at least two years.

4. Be in an undergraduate program either as a part-time or fulltime student.

5. Have demonstrated financial need. (based on FAFSA)

6. Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 (on 4.0 scale).

Guideline 2 was broadened from Champaign county to Illinois to encourage greater participation.

Legal Advocacy Fund News Margaret Stewart, LAF Chair



The Legal Advocacy Fund has been making some important changes. One change is that it will expand its use of friend-of-the-court briefs and will seek such opportunities especially in precedent setting cases. In addition, its support will not be limited to sex discrimination in academia as it has in the past, but will include such cases in all places of employment.

While LAF is consequently not accepting any new plaintiff support applications, it will maintain until December its commitments to the ten plaintiff cases that it currently supports. However it will continue to provide travel and speaking stipends and possibly emergency relief funding to assist with the additional financial burdens that plaintiffs face, such as health decline, job loss, and family obligations.

The new emphasis is a way to keep the AAUW Value Promise, which is: *By joining AAUW, we belong to a com-munity that breaks through barriers so ALL women have a fair chance.* The donations of branch members will provide funds for our annual contribution to LAF later this year.

The Broken Cord by Michael Dorris

When the author adopted a young Native-American child he was unprepared for the serious behavioral, emotional and developmental problems that were soon manifested. His son had fetal alcohol syndrome, and he came to realize that sometimes love is not enough to rescue a profoundly damaged child.

November Book (Native American Heritage Month):

Code Talkers and Warriors by Tom Holm

In WWII the US Marines enlisted native speakers of the Navajo language to create a code for use in the Pacific theater. It was never deciphered by the Japanese and played a major role in the eventual victory. Long unrecognized because the code remained classified, the Navajo code talkers were finally honored for their contributions in 1992. If you cannot get a copy of this book, two others are available and can be substituted.
