

She works for *J & J Legislative* as a contractual lobbyist in Springfield representing many clients, including AAUW, in non-profit education, social justice, municipal, health and human services fields. She follows the legislative process from conception of a bill to getting it signed by the Governor.

Jenni spoke to us about several current issues, including the Bullying Bill (sponsor Representative Kelly Cassidy); the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act (sponsor Rep. Mary Flowers); and the Equal Rights Amendment (Rep. Lou Lang).
