Meet out Newest Member: Maryly Crutcher

After earning her bachelor's degree from UCLA, she gained valuable experience working in a pediatrician's office for a couple of years, as well as teaching in a Montessori school. Since moving to Illinois, she's been involved in teen pregnancy prevention efforts and volunteered for Planned Parenthood. Maryly has been a long-time advocate for women's rights. She has served as an escort for women seeking access to abortion clinics and was also active for many years in the local chapter of National Organization for Women. Maryly has attended several of our monthly Drinks and Dialogue get-togethers. We are very glad to welcome her as a branch member!

Strategic Planning Session

On July 31st, members of the CU AAUW Board met at the Urbana Free Library to create a 2-year strategic plan. We spent several hours creating the plan using the AAUW's strategic planning curriculum. The plan with action steps was completed at a follow-up session on August 15th. We came up with 5 vision ideas and goals with actionable steps for each:

- By June 30, 2017, we will be more visible to the public through letters to the news editor; organizing an annual award ceremony recognizing a woman leader in the community at the annual Wine, Women and Song; asking the news media to cover one CU-AAUW event per year; cosponsoring relevant YWCA/Friday Forum events; placing our events on the News Gazette calendar of events; and hosting one film event per year.
- By June 30, 2017, we will increase membership by 20% through strategic marketing to ensure the sustainability of the Branch. We will educate the current membership about our mission to help support national goals.
- By December 31, 2016, we will start a conversation about mission directions and future funding objectives for our Branch by having at least one membership board meeting.
- By June 30, 2017, we will increase local branch connectivity through regular social gatherings of at least six members per gathering.
- To encourage local membership and make a greater impact, by June 30, 2018, we will send two
 women to the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL); organize and
 convene a program on AAUW's recent research report, "Barriers & Bias;" find one or two other
 opportunities for leadership training for members; encourage the branch membership to take
 AAUW's "implicit bias" test; organize and convene a program on Title IX; and reach out to each of
 the Branch interest groups to encourage them to follow the Barriers & Bias theme.
