AAUW continues to work with organizations, including the League of Women Voters, for a stronger coalition effort to address our concerns with the status of women's issues in 2017. Members are using lobbying efforts in person and by phone, social media, or writing, to make our voices heard at numerous events across the state, at district offices of officials, and at the Capitols. We recommend members contact state and federal officials to encourage passage of legislation pertaining to women's issues, and then for signatory approval, or a veto, or an override of a veto. Recent approval of a state budget demonstrated the role played by advocates increasing the pressure on legislators. If you do not receive alerts from the AAUW Action Network, please go to www.aauw.org and sign up to become a Two Minute Activist; you can easily contact a member of Congress to express your opinion on pending issues of healthcare, equal pay, student loan debt, and Title IX.

Panelists engage in an online process to review applications to select awardees for recommendation to the AAUW Board of Directors for approval. Terms are two years and begin January 1 of each year; approximately half of the panelists are appointed each year. **Prospective panelists must complete an application form by October 31.**
