Branch Supports Parkland Proposed STEM Program

We were delighted to be asked in November to provide a letter of support to Parkland College's application for an AAUW Community Action Grant. These grants provide funds to individuals, AAUW branches, and AAUW state organizations as well as local community-based nonprofit organizations for innovative programs or non-degree research projects that promote education and equity for women and girls (info available at https://www.aauw.org/what-we-do/educational-funding-and-awards/community-action-grants/).

Here is an excerpt from the letter of support:

The Champaign-Urbana, Illinois branch of AAUW is pleased to endorse Parkland Community College's application for a Community Action Grant to help fund a summer program promoting STEM for girls ages 12-15. Girls' Quest would be offered as part of their well-respected College for Kids program. College for Kids has been part of our community for many years, and their various enrichment offerings are well-attended and highly anticipated by children and their parents. A camp promoting STEM for girls would be a wonderful addition.

Our branch co-sponsored a STEM careers conference at the University of Illinois last year and hopes to do so this year also. That conference targets college-age women who are already in STEM fields and seeks to help them in choosing careers. AAUW's "Start Smart" was one of the programs at the conference last year.

Our branch is excited to be offered this opportunity to partner with Parkland, our area community college, and reach out to a younger group of young women.

Each scholarship provides the student with \$1,000 for the academic year. Ms. Wilson is a nursing student with plans to complete her bachelors degree. She lives in Tuscola, enjoys camping with her family and participates in regular volunteer activities. In her letter to the branch, she said "Thank you for taking a chance on a woman who has been out of school for 10 years."

Ms. Onyekwe graduated from a high school in Nigeria in 2002, emigrated to the US in 2013 and now lives in Champaign. She is currently a nursing student at Parkland with plans to get her bachelors degree. If e shared these comments after the fall luncheon "This scholarship has been instrumental towards the actualization of my dream of being a nurse. Thank you once again. I love teaching. I volunteered in Africa in public health departments and I am very passionate about women and children's issues."

Ms. Bartley was selected to receive \$500 for her final semester at Parkland. She is employed as bookkeeper for a small company and credits the position for helping her find her career path. She shared "It's amazing how I have already accomplished so much...Now I know for sure what I want to do and how I want to support my family."



Branch Receives "Mystery" Bequest

When branch president and vice-president for finance, Laura Keller and Pam Erickson respectively, received calls and emails concerning a donation from the estate of Audrey Stewart, they were curious about her connection to the branch. A phone call to national AAUW yielded the information that the national office had been notified of Ms. Stewart's death in May and that she had been 108 years old at the time of her death. They knew that she had been a Life Member for many years and had been a resident of Lexington, Kentucky. However, they had no record of her connection to AAUW-CU.

Noting that a "Mrs. Charles E. Stewart" was listed as a past president of our branch from 1959-1962, we thought we'd figured it out. Thanks to the internet, we were able to verify that, indeed, Audrey Stewart was that past president, and that her obituary included that connection.

Audrey Moore was born in 1910 and attended Champaign public schools. She received her degrees from UIUC, and married Charles Stewart in 1935. The couple lived in Champaign until 1962 when they moved to Lexington, Kentucky. Ms. Stewart was active in Phi Mu and Altrusa Club in that city.

We appreciate the \$500 donation to our scholarship fund from her estate and are glad we solved the mystery of her local connection. When her grandson was told that his grandmother's donation would go towards helping women continue their educations after an interruption, he said that he knew that would please her.
